Collaborating for a Digitally Connected Dorset

On 29 August, the Northern Tasmanian Development Corporation (NTDC) facilitated the Dorset Community Digital Planning Workshop. This significant event brought together key stakeholders, including NBN and Telstra, to explore the challenges and opportunities in advancing the region's



digital infrastructure and capabilities.

During the session, participants identified several key concerns, such as mobile coverage—particularly during peak holiday seasons—the affordability of digital services, and the need for community-wide public Wi-Fi. These issues reflect ongoing collaborative efforts between Dorset Council, NTDC, and service providers to advocate for funding and improvements in digital access across the region.

Rather than taking the lead, Dorset Council is working alongside digital service providers and regional partners to advocate for better digital infrastructure. A key priority is securing funding to enhance mobile connectivity and broadband services in high-demand areas such as Bridport, Scottsdale, and Derby, as well as extending the digital footprint to outer regions.

In addition to infrastructure, we are

committed to promoting digital literacy within the community, particularly for disadvantaged groups such as older residents and those with lower incomes.

There are opportunities for the North East Chamber of Commerce to play a pivotal role in advocating for these improvements and participating in initiatives aimed at supporting digital literacy training. Together, we can make a substantial impact by helping businesses and individuals across the North East improve their digital skills.

The Dorset Community Digital Plan is a collective effort to create a more digitally inclusive future. We look forward to collaborating with local businesses, community groups, and residents as we seek funding and roll out projects that will keep our region connected and prepared for the future.

Business Tasmania: Enabling Business Grant Program

For those considering applying for the Enabling Business Grant Program later this year, the guidelines have been updated with two major updates.

The program is now opening a week earlier on 22 October 2024.

GST does not apply to grants distributed under this



program, but grants may be treated as assessable income depending on individual circumstances. Applicants should seek independent advice on the tax implications of any grants received.

The Enabling Business Grant Program helps Tasmanian businesses to grow, adapt and innovate by providing grants of between \$2,500 and \$10,000 for capital purchases that align to the enabling business and technology themes of the Small Business Growth Strategy 2026.

The guidelines have been made available in advance of the program opening to provide applicants plenty of time to review them, consider their eligibility and identify the eligible capital purchases to include in an application. The promotion starts on the 29th of October and collection of tickets and closing date is on the 13th of December. Date drawn will be Monday, 16th of December.

This year, the late-night shopping will take place on Friday, 6th of December, providing extra opportunities for

locals to enter the promotion and in turn help support our wonderful outlets in the Dorset District.



Visit Northern Tas/THA networking event held in Derby

On behalf of Chamber, Maria Branch (President) and Sue Farnell (Secretary) were invited to attend the VNT/THA networking event held at Lot 40, Derby. Below is a summary of the evening written by Darren Martello.

Hospitality businesses play such a crucial role in providing amazing experiences for visitors and locals alike. It is often the experience someone has in a café or restaurant, the interaction they have with locals, the stories they hear about the place, that will have them returning and sharing their experience with others.

On Tuesday 17th September, more than 25 hospitality and tourism operators gathered at Lot 40 in Derby to hear from Visit Northern Tasmania CEO Tracey Mallett and from Dave Noonan of Tasmanian Hospitality Association's Great Customer Experience on the importance of creating wonderful experiences for guests which in turn contributes to the visitor economy.

Tracey spoke of the importance of storytelling, brand, sharing your positive

impact and the direct translation this has on visitor numbers. Visit Northern Tasmania's role in tourism is to ensure regional dispersal and yield across the north of the State and a good experience can directly translate to positive economic benefits to a business. Dave then spoke about the collaboration and education potential to provoke business growth. Through engagement and interaction, the room was able to compile a whole itinerary of things to do for anybody visiting Derby and surrounds.

Additionally, the benefits of a listing on the Australian Tourism Data Warehouse (ATDW) were touched upon, with operators encouraged to utilise the services of Visit Northern Tasmania to ensure they are listed and up to date on this platform which ensures their businesses and events information are fed through to the Tourism Tasmania team, Discover Tasmania and Visit Northern Tasmania websites, and through to the VNT's new events platform. This is a free listing, which provides other great marketing opportunities such as

inclusion in The Off Season and other Tourism Tasmania marketing campaigns.

It was an eye-opening session for many and the key message around working together and co-promoting each other, will lead to longer visitation in the town and therefore greater contributions to the economy. It was the second stage of the Great Customer Experience in the area and The Blue Derby Foundation are keen to delve further into this education and skill development opportunity for all businesses within Derby.
